ETCOG Grants \$85,123 to Continue CodeRED Emergency Notification System for a Sixth Year

Kilgore, TX, November 26, 2014: On November 6th the ETCOG Executive Committee approved a sixth year of funding CodeRED, a reverse emergency notification system, for the East Texas region as a part of its public safety program. The CodeRED system, funded by a Homeland Security grant, is a telephone communication service that allows the county/city Emergency Management Coordinator to quickly notify citizens about emergency situations such as:

- o Tornadoes and storm events;
- o Drinking water contamination;
- o Utility outage;
- o Evacuation notice and route;
- o Missing person;
- o Fires or floods;
- o Bomb threat;
- o Hostage situation;
- o Chemical spill or gas leak; and
- o Other emergency incidents where rapid and accurate notification is essential.

The CodeRED system has been contracted through the Emergency Communications Network since 2009 for all of the counties served by ETCOG, with the exception of Henderson County, due to their 9-1-1 district already providing a reverse notification system. A total of six years of billing with a sum of \$810,064 has been granted by ETCOG, to date, to provide East Texas with CodeRED including the 2014-2015 contract approved for \$85,123. A breakdown of this year's contract for the East Texas region is as follows:
